Get a good night's sleep!



for getting a healthy night's sleep at:



Literacy

In Literacy this month, we are:

- learning about **prefixes**, and exploring how prefixes influence and give clues to word meanings;
- learning what a connective is and knowing when connectives are used;
- identifying and choosing connectives to use in our writing;
- locating and sequencing words in alphabetical order;
- identifying features of information texts;
- learning how to scan texts, to locate key words or phrases, useful headings and key sentences;
- creating our own information text;
- continuing to practise our formation of horizontal and diagonal joins in handwriting activities; and
- identifying the most common representations of the sounds: 'r', 'l', 's', 'k', 'ch/tch' and 'j'.

We are learning to code!

We are learning to code, using a computer programming language called **Scratch**. As we create with Scratch, we learn to think creatively, work collaboratively and reason



systematically. Try it out at home, using www.scratch.mit.edu, and let us know how you get on!

Numeracy

In Numeracy this month, we are:

- rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000;
- making and justifying estimates;
- adding whole numbers using written methods:
- **subtracting** whole numbers using **written methods**;
- revising multiplication and division facts for all times tables;
- exploring and describing the properties of common 3D shapes;
- exploring the relationship between 2D and 3D shapes; and
- continuing with our work in mental mathematics and problem solving.

Topic

We are continuing with the topic of 'My body'. We will be:

- learning about joints what they are and where in our body they are located;
- learning about the position of the major organs in the body, their function and importance;
- exploring what it means to have a healthy lifestyle;
- identifying stages of human development; and
- carrying out **investigations** about our body!
