## Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

Ambassabione We are proud to announce that we now have trained Anti-Bullying Ambassadors in Year Five. These pupils attended a workshop in Enniskillen on $6^{\text {th }}$ November, 2018. The boys and girls were wonderful ambassadors for Omagh Integrated Primary School and we are all really looking to working together on this vitally important work in the months ahead.


## Literacy

- We are going to take part in factual research and report writing. We will 'Read all about it!', as we read and respond to news stories. We will identify the main features of newspaper texts. We'll also have a go at writing newspaper style recounts.
- Our focus for grammar will be to look at verb tenses. In our punctuation work, we will explore the use of speech marks in writing.
- In our phonics work, we will be exploring ways that we can write the 00, igh, oy and ue sounds.
- We will also begin to explore learning about suffixes.
- We'll be continuing with joined handwriting, practising our formation of horizontal and diagonal joins.


## Topic Work

We will be continuing with our topic on
Ancient Egypt. We will:

- learn about Howard Carter and Lord Carnarvon's discovery of
Tutankhamun's tomb;
- find out about Egyptian gods and goddesses; and
- learn more about Pharaohs.


## Numeracy

We will learn multiplication and division facts for the eight times tables and nine times tables.

We will complete work on area:

- introducing the square centimetre and the notation $\mathrm{cm}^{2}$;
- measuring and drawing shapes, with an area involving $1 / 2 \mathrm{~cm}^{2}$; and
- investigating drawing different shapes with the same area.

We will practise formal written addition and subtraction methods involving three and four-digit numbers.

We will take part in time-telling activities;

- learning how to read the time in 5 minute intervals on analogue and digital displays; and
- writing times in 5 minute intervals, using 12-hour notation and a.m. / p.m.


## I.C.T

We are learning to code, using a computer programming language called Scratch. As we create with Scratch, we learn to think creatively, work collaboratively and reason systematically.
