Literacy

We will finish our class novel, 'The Iron Man' and complete activities linked to the book, such as writing a book review and a blurb.

World Book Day is coming up on 7th March, and this will give us a wonderful opportunity to celebrate reading and to promote the power of books!

We'll focus some of our activities on punctuation, and will be exploring the use of the apostrophe to show possession.

We'll also have a chance to revise the use of the question mark and exclamation mark.

Non-fiction writing will be another focus for us this month. To tie in with our work on Mighty Me, we'll be writing an **information text** on the organs of the human body.

We'll also get a chance to experiment with poetry, as we take part in some **limerick** writing.

We'll continue to work on our **joined** writing and will keep working hard on those diagonal and horizontal joins! In our phonics, we'll explore the use of ch/tch, learn ways of spelling the **j sound** (j, ge, g, dge) and **k sound** (c, ck, Ch, cc, k, lk, qu) as well as looking at ant / ent word endings.

Numeracy

Weight

- Use and understand terms such as kg / g;
- know and use the relationships between familiar units of weight;
- know the equivalent of one half, one quarter, three quarters and one tenth of 1kg in g; and
- record estimates and readings from scales. **Shape / Symmetry**
- Describe and classify 2D shapes;
- recognise types of triangles;
- make shapes: for example, construct polygons by paper folding;
- recognise lines of symmetry in shapes and designs; and
- complete symmetrical patterns with one or two lines of symmetry, extending this to designs which include half squares.

The World Around US

We'll continue working on our topic of **Mighty Me**. This month, we plan to:

- Develop our awareness about aspects of dental hygiene;
- carry out some science experiments on eggs;
- learn about the life of Helen Keller;
- understand how **sound** is produced; and
- learn about the different ways of **making sounds**.
